In earlier times he was a member of the Italian American Club of Clearwater and served as the treasurer and Emcee under three different presidents.

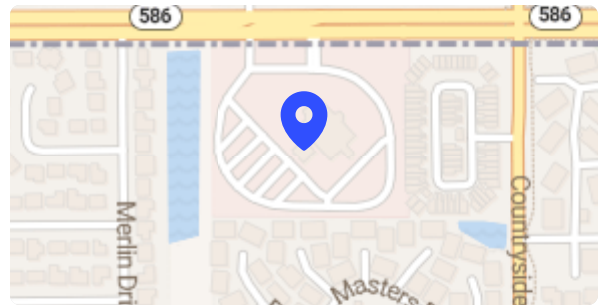

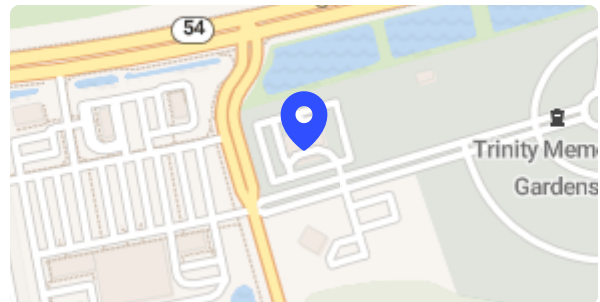

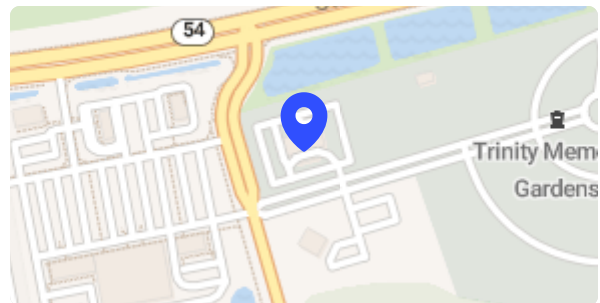
