Hannah Patel was born on January 16, 1948, in Ahmedabad, India, and passed away peacefully on March 4, 2026, surrounded by the love of her family.

In Hindi and Gujarati, two of Hannah’s native languages, the word masti means joy, playfulness, and a spirited love of life. It was a word that fit Hannah perfectly. She was often the first to the dance floor, quick to start a song, and happiest when sharing a meal, she had lovingly prepared for friends and family. Entertaining came naturally to her, but what made Hannah truly special was her gift for bringing out the masti in everyone around her.

In 1969, Hannah bravely journeyed to the United States with her sitar, her faith, and a hopeful vision for the future. She believed deeply in the power of education and often said it was the foundation of opportunity and the key to achieving the American Dream. With determination and hard work, she pursued her studies and earned her Master’s degree in Biology and Chemistry.

Soon after, Hannah met and married the love of her life, Harish Patel. Together, they built a life rooted in love, resilience, music, and family. Over their 55 years of marriage, they lived in many parts of the country, performing on stage and forming lifelong friendships wherever they went. After many years in the Midwest and Northeast, they spent the last 10 years in Tampa, Florida, a community Hannah embraced and cherished dearly.

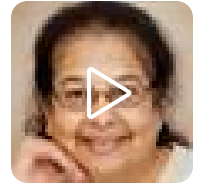

Your life was a blessing, and your memory is a treasure. You are loved beyond words and missed beyond measure. Though you are gone, thank you for all the sweet and gentle things you left behind — in my home, in my heart, and in my thoughts. Let me share who Hannah is. I use the present tense 'is' because she will forever live in our hearts. We are confident that though she is absent from the body, she is now present with the Lord Jesus Christ. Some of the stories that reflect Hannah's caring and selfless nature: When Hannah was a young girl, there was an elderly woman who lived alone under a tree near their family home. This woman had no family, so Hannah took it upon herself to care for her. From dawn until nightfall, Hannah would not eat a single meal without making sure this woman was fed. Every night, she would check on her before going to bed and gently cover her with a blanket. I also recall my own childhood. As the youngest of the family, I remember days when we visited Kankaria Lake and the Zoo. On the return journey, when I was too tired to walk, Hannah would carry me on her shoulder all the way from Kankaria Lake to Jamlapur. But her care and support did not end there. Hannah stood by me throughout my life, unwavering in her love and strength. Hannah was a gifted and talented person. She was a leading stage actress and a professional vocalist in Ahmedabad, known for her grace and skill. Her journey to the United States began in September of 1969, when she left India to pursue studies in medicine in Los Angeles. Her travels took her from Mumbai, via Singapore, to the USA. During the flight from Bombay to Singapore, Hannah fell seriously ill with severe vomiting, and the airline refused to let her continue her journey, admitting her to a hospital for three days. Once well, she resumed her travels to LA. Upon arrival, she called the university, only to be told that her admission had been given to someone else, as she had missed the scheduled pick-up. Imagine the fear of a young woman from India, alone in an unknown city in the USA, with no place to go. But Hannah was always protected by God, for He had a plan for her. In her moment of need, she turned to the yellow pages and found the number for a Methodist church. She called, and the pastor himself answered the phone. Hannah explained her situation, and the pastor immediately came to the airport to pick her up. She stayed with the pastor's family for a few days before moving to Chicago, where she met the love of her life, Harishbhai. Hannah's faith remained unshaken, and God was always by her side. Together, Hannah and Harish raised two wonderful, loving children, Niel and Payal. They lived in many places across the United States, and wherever they went, Hannah was embraced and loved by all who knew her for her warm and caring nature. Hannah was the first in her family to settle in the United States. She sponsored her siblings and helped each of them build a new life in America. We are incredibly blessed to have had such a loving sister. Reading the heartfelt tributes from others about her life fills my heart with overwhelming joy and tears. What a blessing it has been to be part of Hannah's life. She will forever be remembered, loved, and missed."

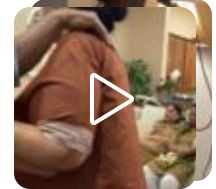
